MISSISSIPPI LIME COMPANY ANNOUNCES CEO SUCCESSION

Mississippi Lime Company announced on August 30, 2021 that Paul Hogan has been named President & Chief Executive Officer of Mississippi Lime Company. Hogan will report to Anderson Fincher, President and CEO of HBM Holdings. Hogan succeeds Bill Ayers, President and CEO of Mississippi Lime Company, who will retire in early 2022 following a transition period.

Ayers joined Mississippi Lime Company in 1999 as the VP, Sales and Marketing. He assumed additional responsibilities in Operations and as President until he was formally appointed CEO in 2016. Under Bill's leadership, Mississippi Lime has grown both organically and through acquisitions, and has advanced the organization's commitment to safety and people development.

Paul Hogan joins Mississippi Lime from Italmatch Chemicals, where he most recently held the role of Chief Executive Officer of the Americas. In this position, he led their specialty chemical business in the Americas while also serving as the Global Vice President responsible for their oil and gas division. Previously, Paul held key positions of increasing responsibility with Solvay, Emerald Kalama Chemicals, Dupont Dow Elastomers, Elementis, and Dynea. Paul holds a

Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry with Business Studies from the University of Abertay in Scotland, and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Durham Business School in England.

Andy Fincher commented, "Today we celebrate Bill's success, and welcome Paul as the incoming leader to guide Mississippi Lime through the next phase of the Company's remarkable journey. Paul's impressive experience will serve to build on the outstanding legacy Bill and others have created."

Bill Ayers said, "My time at Mississippi Lime has been the most fulfilling of my life. I am confident that our next generation of leaders will take the company to even greater heights. Paul is joining Mississippi Lime at a time of strength and momentum. It has been a great honor to lead Mississippi Lime."

"I am thrilled and humbled to be leading Mississippi Lime's next chapter and building on the legacy that has been established. I look forward to working with such a committed and high performing team," added Hogan.

STE. GENEVIEVE UNION CONTRACT RATIFIED

Mississippi Lime Company reported that hourly employees and drivers represented by Laborers Local 829 and Steelworkers Local 169G in Ste. Genevieve, MO ratified a new fiveyear collective bargaining agreement effective July 1, 2021. The new agreement includes a significant wage increase in the first year along with competitive increases in each of the remaining years of the contract. Benefits and other compensation elements were also enhanced as a result of negotiations. Bill Ayers said, "The offer was very fair and shows

our commitment to being one of the top employers in the area. We are fortunate to have an outstanding workforce dedicated to our business and our customers."

Ayers complimented Union representatives and members of management's negotiating team for their hard work in reaching the new agreement and for the professional manner in which negotiations were conducted. He said, "It's a difficult time to negotiate a new collective bargaining agreement. With a

tight labor market and economic uncertainty, we must focus on the long-term sustainability of our business which includes offering competitive compensation and benefits. This enables us to attract and retain the best talent."

Ayers added, "The negotiations were conducted in a spirit of mutual problem solving. Our core values at Mississippi Lime Company serve as management's guiding principles in all we do, including contract negotiations."

MLDS PARKING LOT IMPROVEMENTS ENSURE SAFETY

Parking lot improvements to the MLDS lot at our Ste. Genevieve, Missouri location have been completed! This large-scale project started out more than two years ago, when a Learning Team gathered and discussed how to improve safety for MLDS drivers using the lot. The team recognized that a few items needed to be addressed to help the flow of traffic and to keep drivers, and others safe. Alex Litsch, Project Manager and Ethan Hamilton, MLDS Terminal Manager, partnered to run the project and ensure it was successfully completed.

The parking lot had a steep slope that could make it unsafe when it was wet. The slope also caused issues

with runoff. As a result, one corner of the parking lot was raised by 13 feet and asphalt was added across the entire lot. The asphalt created an easier surface to treat when it snows, and will help reduce or eliminate slips, trips and falls as drivers are walking to and from the building.

Another improvement was to create a dedicated entrance and exit for tractor-trailers, making the lot one-way. This has greatly improved the flow of traffic for all drivers. In addition to these two major improvements, additional lighting was added for more safety. The parking lot is now a safer and more secure lot for all MLDS drivers and trucks.
